With just one week remaining in the Season of Lent, I urge parishioners to come along to Tuesday evening's Stations of the Cross at St Kevin's Cardiff; at the new time of 6.15pm. Fr Joseph and myself have been asked to help at St Paul's Gateshead for the Sacrament of Reconciliation that night. I also recommend Thursday evening's hour of Adoration and Benediction from **5.30pm** at St Philip's Kotara - 'A quiet hour with the Lord'.

Then on Friday 23 March from 10.00am, drop in to St Columba's Adamstown at any time, to spend a time in contemplation and reflection with the Blessed Sacrament. Benediction will begin at 6.00pm, then silent reflection upon the Way of the Cross at 6.20pm. Fr Joseph will be available for **Reconciliations** throughout the day.

Last Saturday evening, a selection of artworks on the theme of Holy Week and Easter were displayed at St Philip's Kotara. During the Mass, St Pius X Religious Studies Coordinator Simone Kelly, announced the winner of the All Saints Parish prize and two additional prizes awarded by the school. The competition was open to all Yr 8 students. Isabel Gildenhuys' colourful landscape "Hope on the Horizon', depicted a fire damaged forest being brought to life by a distant rising sun.

Sophie Hunter's untitled work, showed golden light bursting around a gnarled tree. A keyhole in the tree's trunk, suggested the centrality of the 'Cross' in our Catholic belief. In the work by Charlotte Jones, an Easter flower grows triumphantly at the foot of a wooden cross. A smaller exhibition of the works submitted, may be seen in the foyer of St Columba's Church, Adamstown this Sunday; before and after, 9.30am Mass.

Another Catholic Education Week event took place last Friday evening in the finely restored St Johns Chapel in central Maitland. Amongst the students awarded the 'Bishop's Award' (to assist families with some education costs) were Helayna McCloy and Chloe Anson-Smith.

Winners of these awards are selected for the exemplary role they play in their school community and for their attendance and involvement in parish life. As in previous years, we are proud to see the young people of All Saints Parish, acknowledged in this way.


5th Sunday of Sunday Lent - Year B

FIRST READING Jer 31:31-34

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks - when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.

I tell you most solemnly,

unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies,

it yields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life.

If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say:

Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour.

Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.'

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.
