

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - 3rd June 2018

Today's liturgy carries the theme of living in communion with God as it presents a great religious symbol – the eating and drinking of food.



As the liturgy has developed over 2,000 years, it is possible to overlook that it began as a gathering of people round a table to share nourishment.

Though Jesus had many meals with his disciples and friends, only a few are written about in the Gospels. The meal this Sunday's Gospel talks about, is His final one. (Mark 14:12-16, 22-26) So this gathering had a special, significance. It also coincided with the Jewish celebration of freedom called the Passover. During this meal Jesus gave the ritual bread and wine a new meaning, that of His own life.

When he was no longer physically present with the disciples they were to continue to gather around a table, to share bread and wine, and by his words, 'This is my body; this is my blood,' he promised that He will be present in these gatherings. That is what we are doing every time we gather for Eucharist. today he invites us once again. 'Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed.' (**Proverbs 9:5**) From a New Testament Commentary by Mary Coloe PBVM.

There are several good things happening at Cardiff this Sunday. Not only are the children beginning their preparation for the **Sacrament of Eucharist** but the School / Parish Family Mass, is being combined with a celebration of **St Kevin**; whose feast falls this year on the solemnity of the **Body and Blood of Christ**. This Irish saint lived a hermit's life in a cave, surviving on natural plants and herbs. After attracting a following, he established a monastery at Glendalough. He was an acquaintance of **St Columba** and other renowned Irish contemporaries. Several miracles associated with food or animals, were attributed to him during his long lifetime. He died in the year 618 at the reputed age of 120 years.

People from all corners of **All Saints** and from parishes beyond, will gather at St Philip's this coming **Friday June 8** for the annual Day of Prayer and Reflection, led by our bishop. It is one of several such days held throughout the year in various parishes. Bishop Bill will celebrate the **9.15am Mass** that morning and remain to guide those present, through till 2.30pm. I recommend this helpful and rewarding day to all from Adamstown, Cardiff and Kotara. Regular Friday Mass-goers may also like to stay on for a few hours of spiritual nourishment. **See the notice on page 3.**

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - Year B

First Reading Ex 24:3-8

A reading from the book of Exodus

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standingstones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he Israelites directed certain young holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. 'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

Second Reading Heb 9:11-15

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the

blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

Gospel Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark
On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the
Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to
Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the
preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent
two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city
and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water.
Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which
he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining
room in which I can eat the passover with my
disciples?" He will show you a large upper room
furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the
preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and
went to the city and found everything as he had told
them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.'
