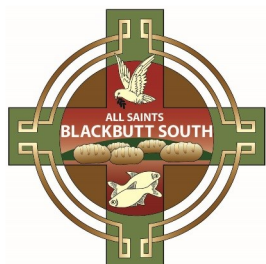

Parents of children Year Three and older, gathered at St Philip's Church on Wednesday evening; for enrolment in the 2018 Reconciliation programme. They included children from State schools of the region; and St Kevin's, St Columba's and St James' schools.

Although parents must be the first teachers of Faith for their child, All Saints Parish has once again formed three volunteer teams to assist in this task, by providing **two essential lessons** for this sacrament. Times are as follows:

Adamstown: Mondays 29 October and on 5 November, from 3.30pm.

Cardiff: Thursday 1 Nov and 8 Nov from 4.00pm.

Kotara: Monday 29 Oct and 5 Nov and Thursday from 3.30pm
Thursday 1 Nov and 8 Nov from 3.30pm, **also**
Tuesday 30 Oct and Tuesday 6 Nov at 7.00pm.

Reconciliation and the later Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist, take the child a further step on the journey towards adult faith, within the context of parish worship.

Hence, parents are asked to accompany their child to Mass during the time of preparation; to attend each of the classes and to assist your child by example and encouragement, in understanding God's forgiveness as represented by this sacrament. The children will take a group role in these Masses.

A Liturgy of Reception of the Reconciliation is being planned and will be announced to families during the course.

Each child is asked to work through the book, 'Our Family Prepares'; completing Week 1 at home, in time for the first lesson.

We hope that parents will enjoy walking alongside their child for this important stage of their journey towards adult faith.

Items discussed at the October **Parish Team Meeting** last Tuesday evening, included the All Saints Weekend, Vigil Mass and **BYO Picnic**. School families and all parishioners are urged to celebrate in the grounds at St Philip's, straight after the 5.30pm vigil Mass. Bring your own salads and sweets to share. **Saturday 3rd November** Coffee, tea, cordial and sausages will be supplied.

Because All Saints Parish includes Cardiff, Adamstown and Kotara; this 'patronal party' is for everyone.

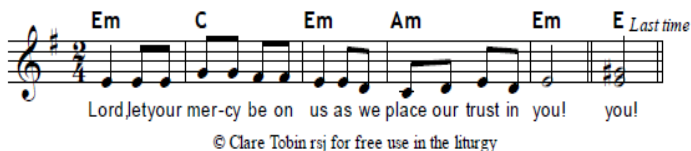
FIRST READING *Is 53:10-11*

GOSPEL *Mk 10:35-45*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master,' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'



When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'
