Catholic Mission staged the 2018 Schools mission liturgy at St Pius X High School on Wednesday 24 October with the help of students and teachers of St James primary school and St Pius X high school. The event was planned and prepared by Richard Cootes but ably taken up by teaching colleagues, as he was absent on the day due to overseas travel.

Music, accompanying dramatised readings and prayers, was played by several of **St Philip's** well-known young musicians, now in high school but onetime St James pupils. Bishop Bill Wright also took a central role and commended the students from regional schools for their concern for the poor people of the world.

The annual liturgies focus on works supported by Catholic Mission. In this case; an education for the people of Myanmar. This was also the focus of a recent Mission appeal in All Saints Parish, to which the sum of **\$3,737.00** was given locally. Catholic schools around the Diocese, also raise funds to help in this work called, 'Healing a nation through education'.

Both **St Columba's** and **St James** schools held parent information gatherings for incoming kinder classes this past week. They were given an outline of the 'adventure' their child will embark upon in 2019, by key personnel of each school. They were also reminded of the logical connection between Catholic school and parish communities, by parish team member Helene O'Neill. The kinder enrolment numbers, show that parents still place great importance on a 'faith based' education.

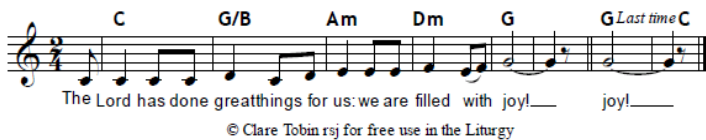
