## Feast of Pentecost Year C - 9th June 2019

Following the weeks of Easter when the colour white predominated, this weekend we use the colour red in our church décor, to symbolise the fire of the Holy Spirit hovering over the disciples and over us. It's no wonder that parishes schedule Confirmation for this feast, whenever it is possible. In the **Alleluia verse** we cry out in hope. "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your people and light the fire of Your love in us". As this **Pentecost** day marks the end of the Easter Season, you will notice that the Easter Candle will now be moved from beside the lectern and placed by the baptismal font.



The acclamation in the **second reading** 'Jesus is Lord!' is rich in meaning for both Jewish people and Christians. **Lord** ( *kýrios* ) was the official title of the Roman emperor. To use this title 'Lord' for Jesus, is to ascribe to him the attributes of God the Father.

Paul's discourse on the varieties of functions within the Christian community includes his analogy of the diversity in the human body. Each part has its own unique function, but all parts work for the good of the whole. The same is true of our All Saints Parish.

In **John's gospel**, the bestowal of the Spirit occurs on the evening of the day of Resurrection. The doors are locked, illustrating the mysterious character of Jesus' risen body, when he is able to pass through them! He wishes His friends peace, the eschatological blessings of health, prosperity and all good things, thus proclaiming the arrival of this time of fulfilment. He also calls attention to his wounds, showing that He is human, not some kind of ghost from the underworld. He wishes them peace again, bestows the Spirit on them by breathing on them, reminiscent of the creation of Adam ( Gen 2:7). He then commissions them to go forth to declare salvation and judgment. With the bestowal of the Spirit, the disciples are authorised to continue the mission of Jesus. That same mission has been given to us to fulfil.

People who have already collected their new set of envelopes for the **Planned Giving Scheme** may notice that no envelope was included for this week **9 June**. This was unintentional. If you wish, you will find your **numbered envelope** awaiting you. There are also plain envelopes available but please be sure to **put your giver number or name on it**.

## Feast of Pentecost - Year C

### First Reading *Acts 2:1-11*

*A reading from the Acts of the Apostles*

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

### Second Reading *1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13*

*A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians*

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Thy pure beaming radiance give.  
Come, thou Father of the poor,  
Come with treasures which endure;
