The Most Holy Trinity Year C - 16th June 2019

This week **St Columba's Primary School** attended a 'whole school' **Mass** to mark the feast of their patron saint, which fell this year on Pentecost Sunday. Celebrating the Sunday, customarily takes precedence over memorials and optional feasts when the dates coincide. A good number of Parishioners, parents and grandparents also took part in the Tuesday Mass.

On behalf of our Parish Leadership Team I thank those who have already complied with the requirement, to read through the **Diocese Volunteer Handbook** and to carefully fill out the various forms it contains.

Though many people have found this to be an onerous and frustrating requirement, we greatly appreciate your willingness to be properly registered and cleared for service within All Saints Parish.

To those who may not understand the need to develop the handbook and to require people to complete this process (having been a trusted and appreciated volunteer over many years) I must direct you to the handbook itself.

It has been progressively compiled to help us appreciate 'the need for the Diocese to have a consistent, transparent and verifiable process for the induction, formation and management of people who so generously, wish to minister in their parish or the M N Diocese'.

The booklet explains important aspects of volunteering, including – training, safeguarding of others and yourself, responsibility of workers / volunteers, Work Health and Safety, Insurance coverage, Code of conduct and compliance with the Law. It is important for volunteers to have carefully read the booklet, in order to complete all the forms accurately.

Page 4 of the booklet clearly says that these requirements apply throughout the MN Diocese, its' agencies and in each parish. I offer this paragraph from the General Decree of the Bishop of Maitland – Newcastle, given on 4 Sept. 2018: 'It is a requirement of all volunteers to complete an induction and the documents that form the Volunteer Handbook. Failure to complete the induction and associated documents outlined in the handbook, will result in refusal to engage in a volunteer relationship with the diocese of Maitland – Newcastle.' The Wisdom of God cries aloud:


The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded,
