The June issue of '**Justice Trends**' from the Catholic Bishops' Conference focuses on discrimination towards people with a disability and other very relevant matters.

**The Billum** is the magazine from 'Mercy Works'. This June issue looks at the results now flowing from the Works of the Sisters of Mercy in PNG and at their work among refugees in Adelaide.

The winter edition of the Divine Word Missionaries' '**Society Matters**' includes an article on a parish sponsored project to educate young women in Zambia. 'Whoever educates a woman, educates the whole world'.

The latest issue of the Columban Mission Society '**Far East**' is also on display. Articles from all over the missionary world, plus Fr Noel Connolly's thoughts on the 2020 Plenary Council. Pope Francis has said, 'We need to practice the art of listening, which is more than just hearing.'

In the **L'Arche** winter publication you will find an article farewelling the late Jean Vanier who died in Paris on May 7. His passing has been seen as a great personal loss for people all over the world. Jean believed that a Community must be grounded in God. It embraces all people, whatever our character, functional, ethnic or gender difference. Please feel free to take any one of the mags on display, but bring it back for someone else.



## Gospel

Lk 9:11-17

*A reading from the holy Gospel according to  
Luke*

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to  
them about the kingdom of God; and he cured  
those who were in need of healing.  
It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to  
him and said, 'Send the people away, and they  
can go to the villages and farms round about to  
find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely  
place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to  
eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no  
more than five loaves and  
two fish, unless we are to  
go ourselves and buy food  
for all these people.' For  
there were about five  
thousand men. But he said  
to his disciples, 'Get them to  
sit down in parties of about  
fifty.' They did so and made  
them all sit down. Then he  
took the five loaves and the  
two fish, raised his eyes to  
heaven, and said the  
blessing over them; then he  
broke them and handed  
them to his disciples to distribute among the  
crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted,  
and when the scraps remaining were collected  
they filled twelve baskets.
